Assisting Individuals in Crisis & Group Crisis Intervention (GRIN)

3 Day Course: 9/10-12/2023

Many consider this foundational course to be essential in understanding and responding to stress and trauma

Course Description: This 3-day course combines ALL of the content of ICISF's Assisting Individuals in Crisis & Group Crisis Intervention courses.

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; rather, it is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. As physical first aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, crisis intervention is sometimes called "emotional first aid." Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, this course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services for both the individual and for groups. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide several group crisis interventions, specifically demobilizations, defusings and the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD). The need for appropriate follow-up services and referrals, when necessary, will also be discussed.

This course is designed for anyone in the fields of Business & Industry Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, Spiritual Care, and Traumatic Stress. Qualifies of 27 Contact Hours

The ability to recognize and effectively intervene with suicidal individuals is one of the most challenging aspects of crisis intervention. This course is recommended for those without formal mental health training. The course is designed to increase awareness of suicide and equip participants with information and basic skills to respond to a person considering suicide. Discussions, demonstrations, and scenarios will be used to facilitate learning. This is an introductory level course. Qualifies for 7 Contact Hours.

Course Description:

This course is designed to aid you in building a personal culture of resilience and holistic health. Our unique approach is intended to help you learn to better manage the stress in your life in order to increase your potential for happiness, success, and even create a competitive advantage through the creation of what we call Psychological Body Armor ™. There is no "quick fix" in this program. It is not designed to be a "pop psych" feel-good course. Rather, this course contains facts and specific suggestions for actions you can take to enhance your personal resilience, all based upon the latest and most credible science. Refresher course that focuses on the four most commonly used CISM components

Course Description:

For many people there's a need to "brush up" on or review CISM components and procedures because as we all know, "if you don't use it, you'll lose it." MCRA suggests that a best practice is for CISM team members should be to get "refreshed" at least every five years to keep the concepts and ideas fresh in your mind. This course will include a quick review of both the Group and Individual Crisis Response models including CMBs, Defusings, and CISDs. The afternoon portion of the class will offer mock events to "practice" doing CISM events. ICISF's "Group Crisis Intervention and/or Assisting Individuals in Crisis" should be viewed as a prerequisite. Qualifies for 7 Contact Hours.

One Day Class: 9/10/2023

Learn how to apply the ALGEE action plan: Assess, Listen, Give and Encourage the help that is needed.

Course Description:

Mental Health First Aid for First Responders teaches how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders. This 8-hour training gives the skills needed to reach out and provide initial support to someone who is struggling and to connect them to the appropriate level of care. The training focuses on the unique experiences of first responders and is a resources that can make a difference in the lives of the responder, co-works and family.

Program Highlights:

- Discussion of first responders culture, stigma and their relevance to the topic of mental health.
- Outreach tactics to respond to individuals experiencing a mental health crisis.
- Discussion of the specific risk factors faced by many first responders and their families.
- Review of common mental health resources for first responders, their families and those who support them.
- Be able to recognize common signs and symptoms of mental health challenges.
- Recognize common signs and symptoms of substance use.
- Understand how to interact with a person in crisis.
- Know when to connect a person to help.
- Use self-care tools and techniques to keep yourself healthy.

Grief Following Trauma

Cover key grief and loss concepts relating to trauma and traumatic death.

Course Description:

During the course of one's career, it is inevitable that professionals will encounter traumatic death and loss issues both personally and professionally. Professionals often feel ill prepared to provide effective care throughout the grief process. This course will cover key grief and loss concepts relating to trauma and traumatic death. Participants will increase their knowledge of how trauma impacts the grief process and will gain skills for evaluating and supporting persons who have experienced traumatic death and loss. This course is designed for anyone who works with people who experience grief and loss following a traumatic event. Qualifies for 14 Contact Hours.

Managing School Crises:

From Theory to Application

Two Day Class: 9/11-12/2023

A course designed to prepare you for the unpredictable crises that may occur within schools

Course Description:

Designed to prepare school administrators and all educators for the inevitable crises that occur within schools and/or that effect those in schools, this training reflects the three most common phases of a crisis: precrisis planning, acute crisis response and post-crisis activities. Special attention is given to the most common pitfalls (those that pose the most threat to school personnel from a liability standpoint) associated with crisis response activities. Participants of this training are introduced to the CISM framework and specific intervention techniques that can easily be applied within the school setting. These intervention techniques are research-informed and widely recognized for their effectiveness. Participants will be given opportunities to explore the elements of effective crisis management through multiple group activities. Qualifies for 14 Contact Hours.

From Trauma to Addictions

Two Day Class: 9/11-12/2023

Geared to prepare those who will assist individuals and groups who have been exposed to traumatic events and critical incidents.

Course Description:

Explore the relationship between exposure to traumas and the often resulting addiction. Those individuals who work in the "helping professions" are statistically at a greater risk for developing addictions. The use of alcohol, drugs and other activities as a means of self-medicating overwhelming job-related stress and chronic exposure to emotionally charged events is often common place. Personality traits and the human culture of "helpers" are looked at, as well as issues of enabling and family dynamics. Good critical incident stress management MUST include an addictions component which addresses these dangers and gives you the tools necessary to address these dependencies.

This course is for those in the "helping professions" who are at a greater risk to crisis and the potential for substance abuse and additions and those who work with this specialized population. Qualifies for 14 Contact Hours.

First Responder Peer Support Training

Two Day Class: 9/11-12/2023

This class is for those first responders who are, or want to be, on a peer team. Taught by two first responders, you will walk away with the skills to provide effective support to your colleagues.

Course Description:

This course teaches participants in how to provide Peer Support through use of discussion and practical exercises. Participants will understand what it means to ask for and receive help; what Peer Support is and is not, and the fundamentals of responding to colleagues needing support/ in-crisis. Qualifies for 16 Contact Hours.

Topics addressed will include:

- Participants will demonstrate basic Peer Support intervention competencies.
- Participants will be able to engage in initial Peer Support discussion and understand/feel the importance of telling their story in a safe environment
- Participants will understand the ideas and theories behind helping and supporting those in distress
- Participants will be able to provide Peer Support to other members in the class through experiential exercises
- Participants understand how first responder culture influences members and may provide both support and challenges for member's mental well-being and help-seeking abilities
- Participants will be versed in how to address high risk behavior
- Participants will know how and when to refer to a mental health professional.
- Participants will be able to work with and understand basic listening and communication skills.
- Participants will understand psychological issues common to human beings in general and first responders in particular.

The RAM Center provides a recreational retreat with rustic lodging, modern meeting spaces, and recreational activities on the shore of beautiful Higgins Lake.

Sleeping accommodations consist of six separate lodges with <u>double occupancy</u> rooms. The bedrooms contain two beds with access to either shared (with an adjoining room) or communal bathrooms. Each building has a lounge with cable TV, refrigerator, coffee machine and microwave. WIFI is available throughout. The RAM center supplies towels, linens, and housekeeping services (fresh towels and linens, bathroom, and room cleanups). Meals are provided and served family-style.
