## Assisting Individuals in Crisis and Group Crisis Intervention (GRIN)

## About the Training

Training fees include workbooks, morning snacks, coffee, and water for all 3 days.

This 3-day course combines **ALL** of the content of the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation's (ICISF) Assisting Individuals in Crisis & Group Crisis Intervention courses.

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; rather, it is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. As physical first aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, crisis intervention is sometimes called "emotional first aid". Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, this course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services for both the individual and for groups. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined, and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide individual crisis intervention and several group crisis interventions. Specifically, Crisis Management Briefing (CMB), Defusing and the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD). The need for appropriate follow-up services and referrals when necessary will also be discussed.

This beginning/intermediate course is designed for anyone in the fields of Business & Industry Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Law Enforcement, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, Spiritual Care, and Traumatic Stress.

Roxanne is the owner and founder of Crisis Response Connection and has had extensive training in crisis intervention and disaster response. She received her BA in Communication from Regent University, and her master's in social work from Michigan State University. Throughout her studies, she focused on trauma and its impact on the lives of individuals. She has also completed over 300 learning hours of training through the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF), and many other hours of various trauma focused CE courses. This training included emphases on group and individual crisis intervention, suicide, grief, domestic terrorism, mass disasters, line of duty death, crisis management for law enforcement, and childhood trauma. Roxanne is also an approved ICISF instructor for basic group crisis intervention, individual/peer crisis intervention, and CISM law enforcement perspectives. She has contracted with EAP agencies for CISM services, led CISM teams and helped start CISM teams. Currently Roxanne is a trauma therapist with Corewell Health, and a team member of the Midwest Michigan First Responder Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) team. Roxanne passionately believes that CISM plays an important role in responding to both community and first responder trauma. Additionally, Roxanne considers herself an advocate of first responders and spearheaded the formation of the bill (SB 444) in the Michigan state legislature, which provides protected speech (confidentiality) under law for all first responders (including dispatchers) receiving CISM services after traumatic events/calls from peer support teams. This bill was enacted into law on March 15, 2016.
